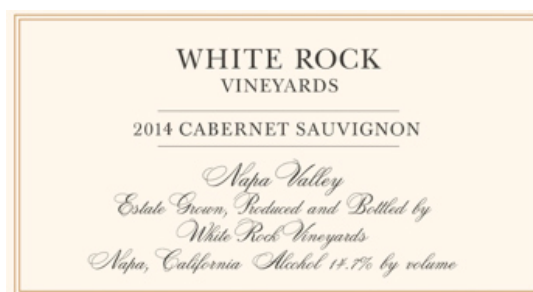
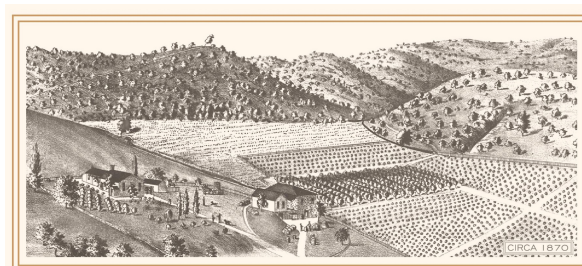

Vineyard: Estate grown, produced, and bottled one mile off Silverado Trail, east of Yountville on the south end of the Stag's Leap Range. East and west facing hilltops with white volcanic ash soils in a microclimate a few degrees cooler than the valley floor. The lower slopes make our Claret.

ACCOLADES

The 2014 Cabernet Sauvignon has a beautiful nose of cassis and blackberry, good clean spiciness from the oak and is medium to full-bodied. This wine can be approached now, but should be even better in several years and last for 15-20 or more. 92 pts
